Pastor's Word

The word for February is "LOVE".

The word is mostly used according to the first definition given in the dictionary: "an intense feeling of deep affection."

American author and radio talk show host Dr. Gary Chapman is noted for a series of books, The Five Love Languages, which deal with human relationships. He is also the senior associate pastor at Calvary Baptist Church in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. He says this about love: "Love is not a feeling it is a choice" and "Love says, 'I choose to do that because I wanna do something for your benefit. I'm gonna give up what I was gonna do and I will do this for you.' That's love. It's giving away your life to another person."

As Christians, we are not to let the world define love for us; we are to let the Word of God define its meaning for us.

The Bible defines love for us in 1 Corinthians 13:4–8a (ESV) "Love is patient and kind; love does not envy or boast; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. ... Love never ends."

As believers, when we think of love we might first think of a verse like John 3:16 (NASB) *"For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him will not perish, but have eternal life."* Or 1 Corinthians 13:13 (NLT) *"Three things will last forever—faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love."*

These verses declare what are important and true; however, to stop with these would be to fail to really understand love.

We need to understand what Jesus teaches about the love we are to understand but also to embrace and live out.

Here is what Jesus says to His followers about love:

³⁴ ["]I am giving you a new commandment, that you love one another; just as I have loved you, that you also love one another. ³⁵ By this all people will know that you are My disciples: if you have love for one another." John 13:34-35 NLT

"If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments and remain in His love." John 15:10 NLT

"This I command you, that you love one another." John 15:17 NLT

Jesus commands us to love one another. If we love Jesus we will obey what He commands us to do. We will love one another.

Love is the distinguishing characteristic of His followers. It is also evidence of the working of the Holy Spirit in our life.

John in his first epistle (1 John 4:7-23) explains how we (as believers) are to love each other. There is no excuse for being unwilling to love a fellow believer:

⁴²⁰ If someone says, "I love God," but hates a fellow believer, that person is a liar; for if we don't love people we can see, how can we love God, whom we cannot see? ²¹ And he has given us this command: Those who love God must also love their fellow believers." 1 John 4:20-21 NLT

Why is understanding love important? Without understanding this we will not live in obedience nor will we fulfill our purpose for being which is to love God and others like Jesus.

"Jesus replied, "'You must love the LORD your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ A second is equally important: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments." Matthew 22:37-40 NLT

Without understanding love and loving one another we will not grow and the church will not grow! *"By this all people will know that you are My disciples: if you have love for one another."* John 13:35 NLT



"...And he has given us this command: Those who love God must also love their fellow believers." 1 John 4: 21^b NLT
